

Please note the following **new Sign-Up Rules for walking Trips** beginning December 1, 2009

- 1. You must be at least **50 years of age**.
- 2. For each trip you may sign up for yourself plus one other person only.
- 3. At any given time, you can sign up for trips scheduled for a **current month and the following month only**. (e.g. In January, you can sign up for January's and February's trips.)
- 4. Sign-ups and cancellations are done directly on a **log-book kept at the front desk**. (No more forms to fill!) And you can check your trip (or waitlist) status on this log at any time.
