WHEREAS, Ruth Ganong continues to volunteer her time to various commissions, committees and non-profit organizations in the region; and

WHEREAS, Ruth Ganong credits her education at BAC for helping to give her the analytical skills and discipline to succeed in any attempted endeavor.
