SUBJECT: Economic development activities for 2010-11 in partnership with the Albany Chamber of Commerce

**RECOMMENDATION**

Approve the allocation of \$9,900 for fiscal year 2010-11 for specific economic development projects and programs to be carried out by Albany Chamber of Commerce.

**BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION**

The City conducted an economic development study last year that identified strategies to attract and retain businesses and business activity in Albany. The City has been working with the business community on efforts to implement these strategies.

For the upcoming fiscal year, the Albany Chamber of Commerce has identified a range of projects and programs that they could undertake in partnership with the City in support of the City's economic development goals. Staff has reviewed the alternatives, and recommends funding the following initiatives that most closely match City economic development strategies:

**ANALYSIS**

The Chamber of Commerce has the ability to implement these programs more efficiently and effectively than City staff or consultants. By partnering with an existing organization, the City is able to leverage its funds in support its adopted vision of a healthy local economy.

## **SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT**

The goal of these programs is to increase support for local businesses, thereby helping to promote a sustainable local economy.

## **FINANCIAL IMPACT**

Total cost for the projects is \$9,900. Funds are available in the City's economic development allocation for fiscal year 2010-11. Other planned expenditures from this source include \$5,000 to the Solano Avenue Association for the Solano Stroll.
