

SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING

MINUTES

City Council Chambers 1000 San Pablo Avenue March 17, 2010 – 7:30 p.m.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Cooper at 7:30 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3-1. Approve minutes from February 17, 2010 meeting (attached)

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

5. ANNOUNCEMENTS/COMMUNICATIONS

Kitahara announced that she attended the Green Summit in Sacramento, and identified a number of upcoming funding opportunities. The Green Festival will be held April 10-11. Transition Albany will be holding the "Joy of life on 2 wheels" in the Edith Stone Room on April 11.

6. REPORTS

6-1. Long Range Planning/Sustainable Development Subcommittee – update

Smith-Heimer reported that the subcommittee met and discussed renewable energy/wind energy. They have decided to focus on CAP implementation at this juncture.

6-2. Urban Landscape Subcommittee – update

Schrift reported that the subcommittee did not meet.

6-3. Education Subcommittee – update

Kitahara reported that the posters/postcards for the Arts & Green festival will be out in April. 15 booths have signed up, and there will be 4-5 workshops.

6-4. Proposed development projects – planning update

Almaguer provided an update – Safeway is meeting with planning to discuss potential projects, Whole Foods project is in the EIR phase. The Sustainability Committee will be included when materials/plans are ready for review.

7. DISCUSSIONS AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON MATTERS RELATED TO THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

7-1. Review existing subcommittees – propose changes to scope/composition as needed

The Committee agreed to develop three new subcommittees: Building Energy/Water Conservation, Food & Agriculture/Green Infrastructure, and Non-land use Transportation.

Cooper, Smith-Heimer, and Lieberman volunteered for the Building Energy/Water Conservation subcommittee.

Kitahara, Smith-Heimer and Schrift volunteered for the Food & Agriculture/Green Infrastructure subcommittee.

Yang and Lieberman volunteered for the Non-land use Transportation subcommittee.

7-2. Climate Action Plan implementation – initial discussion regarding implementation

The Committee discussed how to implement the CAP and provide assistance to staff. Cooper proposed developing subcommittees (detailed in 7-1) to review particular CAP strategy sections and prioritize measures. The subcommittees will meet prior to the next meeting to review the strategies/measures, discuss prioritization and provide an update at the next meeting.

7-3. State Water Efficiency Landscape Ordinance – receive information from planning

Almaguer reported that the Ordinance is currently in effect, however updates can be made to include bay friendly principles as identified by Stopwaste.org.
