- 1. ATTEND FIRST EOC BRIEFING/OR CONFER WITH CITY MANAGER
- PREPARE INITIAL NOTIFICATION FOR WEB-SITE & KALB (SEE ATTACHED EXAMPLE);CONTACT CABLE STAFF OR VOLUNTEERS
- 3. ACTIVATE WEB-SITE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION [MUST USE INTERNET EXPLORER]

 DIRECT TO OUR WEBSITE
- 5. POST ON ALBANY PATCH- DIRECT TO OUR WEBSITE

- 9. PREPARE BULLET POINT SUMMARY INFORMATION TO BE USED FOR MEDIA AND PUBLIC UPDATES; UPDATE WEB SITE; FACEBOOK; PATCH; KALB
- 10. PRINT OUT HARD COPIES AND GET THEM TO POSTING LOCATIONS (MEMORIAL PARK, TERRACE PARK, OCEANVIEW PARK, PIERCE STREET ON FENCING, COMMUNITY CENTER, SOLANO AVENUE KIOSK @ CURTIS)

SECONDARY THINGS TO DO

- 1. SET UP AS NEEDED IN ASSIGNED LOCATION; -PUT ON TV AND BEGIN TO MONITOR
- 2. PLAN FOR THE NEXT OPERATIONAL PERIODS
 - a. Backup personnel needs—may need to call HR to access
 - b. Volunteer needs (runners; news monitors, etc.)
 - c. Schedule for MEDIA updates press conferences if needed
 - d. Attend briefings to continue to update information

<u>INITIAL EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION – SAMPLE</u>

[When and what happened]

ON APRIL 1, 2011, AT 5 PM, A FREAK BLIZZARD STRUCK THE EAST BAY AREA, DROPPING 12 FEET OF SNOW ONTO ALBANY, BERKELEY AND SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES. THERE IS NO INFORMATION AT THIS TIME ABOUT INJURIES AND NO FATALITIES HAVE BEEN REPORTED.

[local information if available]

INTERSTATE I80 AND I580 ARE CLOSED AND CARS ON THE FREEWAY ARE UNABLE TO EXIT.

[How we are responding]

EMERGENCY PERSONNEL ARE ON THE SCENE ASSESSING DAMAGE, AND ASSISTING THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN TRAPPED IN THEIR CARS. HOT CHOCOLATE IS BEING PROVIDED.

[What the public should do]

AT THIS TIME ALAMEDA COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES RECOMMENDS THAT EVERYONE STAY IN THEIR CURRENT LOCATION AND STRONGLY ADVISES AGAINST TRAVEL. THE PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT CAUTIONS AGAINST SNOW SHOVELLING BY THOSE UNFAMILIAR WITH THIS TASK AND THE ASPCA RECOMMENDS BRINGING ALL ANIMALS INSIDE.
