**A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL APPROVING THE UPDATED SALARY RANGE FOR THE POLICE CHIEF**

**WHEREAS**, management and confidential employees of the City of Albany and Albany Municipal Services Joint Powers Authority will begin contributing 4.0-4.5% of wages to CalPERS (California Public Employees Retirement System) effective July 11, 2011; and

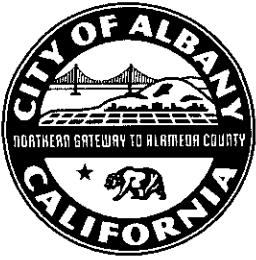
**WHEREAS**, the Police Chief will begin contributing 9.0% of wages to CalPERS (California Public Employees Retirement System) effective July 11, 2011, to be consistent with police safety employees as required in the CalPERS contract; and

**WHEREAS**, a partially offsetting 3.6% salary increase and associated costs would result in a 4.5% net decrease in the Police Chief's wages, to be consistent with the other management and confidential employees.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL** that the monthly salary range for the Police Chief shall be:
