SUBJECT: Temporary Street Closures – Solano Avenue and Key Route

Boulevard

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

- (1) That Council approve the street closure on Solano Avenue from the intersection of San Pablo Avenue to the intersection of Evelyn Avenue for the "Dinner with Albany" event on Saturday, September 29, 2012, from 9:30 AM to 11:30 PM.
- (2) That Council approve the closure of a two-block area of Key Route Boulevard from Thousand Oaks to the El Cerrito border from 12 –3 PM on Sunday, September 22, 2012, for the "Alberrito Streets" event. Closures will be placed on Key Route Boulevard at the intersections of Brighton and Thousand Oaks Avenue. The City of El Cerrito will be closing Ashbury beginning at A Street to the Albany boarder.

BACKGROUND

The Albany Master Fee Schedule requires an Encroachment Permit for any work or activity that occurs within the public-right-of-way. A specific reference in the Master fee Schedule states that, "Group permits for special activities in the City r-o-w, (Solano Stroll, etc). Note: Permit requires Council approval."

Dinner with Albany

The September 29th event will be the third "Dinner with Albany," which has taken place every other year since 2008.

Albany Streets/Alberrito Streets

Albany Streets is modeled after the popular San Francisco event called Sunday Streets. The purpose of Albany Streets is to create a safe, fun, car-free place for people to get out and get active in Albany. For September 22 event, we have teamed up with the City of El Cerrito to create "Alberrito Streets". The event will feature Albany vs. El Cerrito tug-o-war and relay races, as well as, space to walk, skate, bike, jog, hop scotch, yoga, picnic and people watch. Albany residents encouraged to wear green or something with Albany on it.

DISCUSSION

For Alberrito Streets due to the closure of Key Route between Thousand Oaks (Albany) and A Street (El Cerrito), through traffic may detour on Thousand Oaks and use Pomona to reach El Cerrito. Residents on the affected streets will receive a notice regarding the closure at least a week in advance of the event. Staff will be posting the area for "No Parking" four to five days in advance of the event. Police official and Fire officials have been notified of the street closure.

Similarly, "Street Closed Ahead" signs will be placed on Brighton at the corners of Masonic, San Gabriel and Spokane; on Thousand Oaks at the corners of Pomona, Ramona and Carmel; on Key Route at Portland.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT

These events create community and encourage residents to stay off the road and out of cars while enjoying a day/evening in Albany.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Since this is a city-sponsored event, staff recommends waiving the \$26.00 Encroachment Permit Fee for both events.
