# Planning and Zoning Commission Minutes January 17, 2013 Special Meeting

Note: These minutes are subject to Planning and Zoning Commission approval. The minutes are not verbatim. An audiotape of the meeting is available for public review.

### **Regular Meeting**

1. **CALL TO ORDER-** The meeting of the Planning and Zoning Commission was called to order by Chair Arkin in the City Council Chambers at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 17, 2013.

### 4. CONSENT CALENDER

(Consent Calendar items are considered routine and will be enacted by one motion. By approval of the Consent Calendar, the staff recommendations will be adopted unless otherwise modified by the Commission. There will be no separate discussion on these items unless a Commission Member or a member of the audience requests removal of the items from the Consent Calendar.)

A. PA 12-045 Design Review & Parking Exception for 1117 Ordway- The applicant is seeking design review and parking exception approval for a 650 sq. ft. accessory structure in the rear yard at 1117 Ordway. The lot is 7,551 sq. ft. in area. The applicant received administrative design review approval for a 239 sq. ft. accessory structure in 2011. The original accessory structure was constructed and finaled in April 2012. Upon completion, an unpermitted expansion of the structure commenced and a stop work order was issued. The applicant was directed to file a new application to remedy the current situation. The applicant is proposing to use the structure as a multipurpose art studio. Contd. from the 11/28/12 so that the applicant could prepare revised plans based on Commission feedback.

Recommendation: The Planning & Zoning Commission continue the item to a date certain of February 13, 2013 to allow the applicant more time to prepare revised plans.

Commissioner Donaldson clarified that item 4A was just being continued and not approved. Staff indicated this was correct.

Motion to pass approve the Consent Calendar: Eisenmann Seconded by: Pilch

**B.** PA 12-054 2<sup>nd</sup> Story Addition at 949 Ordway- The applicant received Design Review approval for second story addition at 949 Ordway on November 28, 2012. At that time, the Commission approved a front gable roof for the first story. Due to engineering considerations, the applicant is proposing to modified the first story roofline from a front gable design to a shed roof design.

Recommendation: Review and approve the proposed roof form change.

### 5. PUBLIC COMMENT

For persons desiring to address the Commission on an item that is not on the agenda please note that each speaker is limited to three (3) minutes. The Brown Act limits the Commission ability to take and/or discuss items that are not on the agenda; therefore, such items are normally referred to staff for comment or to a future agenda.

Commissioner Arkin welcomed new commissioners Nick Pilch and Doug Donaldson onto the Commission. He noted that Donaldson had previously served on the Commission before for many years. He acknowledge the years of service Commissioners Maass and Panian had contributed.

### 6. DISCUSSIONS & POSSIBLE ACTION ON MATTERS RELATED TO THE FOLLOWING ITEMS

A. General Plan Update Consultant Selection Recommendation- Report from the Subcommittee with a recommendation to the Albany City Council to enter into contract for General Plan Update consulting services with Barry Miller.

Recommendation: forward a recommendation to the Albany City Council.

Ms. Hersch presented the staff report.

PUBLIC HEARING OPENED.

**Barry Miller, project planning consultant -** introduced himself and made himself available for questions.

**David Sanger**- hoped the general plan addressed the issue of wireless communications in Albany.

**Commissioner Donaldson**- requested that the city prioritized getting the current housing element certified to avoid future penalty. He also suggested adding the San Pablo Avenue Vision plan and discussing the effect of sea level rise in the scope. He commended the plan's presentation and said he was looking forward to working with Miller

**Mr. Miller**- stated that the wireless communications issue will be covered in the updated general plan, most likely under Land Use. He said that staff was looking to hire a CEQA consultant to write parts of the EIR.

Commission and that the Commission is empowered to authorized the modified window

detail on the north elevation. Once this change is approved, the application can continue to proceed in the building plan check phase.

The Commission agreed by consent to authorize the window modification.

C. PA 12-046 Metro PCS Modification at 650 Cleveland Ave.- The applicant has filed a zoning clearance application for an existing Metro PCS facility at 650 Cleveland. The scope of work includes installation of one 1 foot microwave dish which is proposed to be located on an existing monopole in the parking lot at 650 Cleveland Ave. The existing monopole is 65 ft. in height. The microwave dish is proposed to be located at a 54 ft. elevation with existing Metro PCS equipment. Removal and replacement of a power cabinet is also proposed. The dish is intended to improve landline telephone service and will replace an existing copper telephone line. The dish does not impact wireless coverage.

Recommendation: Determine if the application complies with the Zoning Clearance requirements contained in Section 20.100.020 which requires compliance with applicable regulations and standards of Chapter 20 "Land Development" of the Albany Municipal Code.

Commissioner Eisenmann rejoined the meeting.

Ms. Hersch presented the staff report.

PUBLIC HEARING OPENED.

**Talin Agahazarian, Metro PCS representative and applicant**- summarized the project and made herself available for questions.

Commissioner Eisenmann- asked for a description of the dish.

**John Schwartz, project engineer**- showed an example of the microwave units that are in use and explained how they worked.

Ms. Hersch- clarified that the top of the cell tower was approved in 1994 and the unpermitted part of the issue was the mysterious increase in the tower's height.

Commissioner Eisenmann- stated that she was willing to pass this item as the tower is at a desirable location for cell phone companies and the additional microwave dish would be among the bottom ring of dishes on the tower make it below the 55 ft. limit. She asked how close the antennas could be vertically to one another.

Commissioner Donaldson- agreed with Eisenmann's suggestion of approval.

**John Schwartz**- noted that different wireless companies use different bandwidths and often collocate with just a few vertical feet between antennas. In response to Commissioner Moss's inquiries he added that the other antennas did not all have to be turned off when the new antenna is installed. The installation is done live and the antennas are turned off one by one as the installer goes around the tower.

Commissioner Arkin- said that the information provided from Metro PCS was very helpful.

**Clay Larson, Albany resident**- asked about the height difference between the lower and upper ring of antennas on the tower. Ms. Hersch noted that the tower was originally approved at 58 ft and the lower ring was at a 49 ft elevation.

Commissioner Arkin- noted that there is roughly 15 ft between the top of one microwave dish and another one vertically below it.

D. PA 12-043 Metro PCS Modification 1600 Posen (St. Mary's)- The applicant has filed a zoning clearance application for an existing Metro PCS facility at St. Mary's College High School. The scope of work includes installation of one 1 foot microwave dish which is proposed to be located behind an existing screen wall. The dish is intended to improve landline telephone service and will replace an existing copper telephone line. The dish does not impact wireless coverage. Since the dish will be screened, visual impacts are not expected.

Recommendation: Determine if the application complies with the Zoning Clearance requirements contained in Section 20.100.020 which requires compliance with applicable regulations and standards of Chapter 20 "Land Development" of the Albany Municipal Code.

Commissioner Eisenmann recused herself due to the proximity of her residence to the project site.

Ms. Hersch presented the staff report.

PUBLIC HEARING OPENED.

**Talin Agahzarian, Metro PCS representative and applicant** - pointed out the similar nature of this project and item 6C. She made herself available for questions. She

explained that the fiberglass screening allowed the antennas to see through.

Clay Larson, Albany resident- noted that the staff report did not discuss height.

Ms. Hersch- stated that as page A4 of the plans show, the top of the height from the screen enclosure is 50 ft and Metro PCS antenna below is at 49 ft.

Ms. Hersch- noted the project went through the administrative review process 10 years ago.

### PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED.

Commissioner Arkin- mentioned that a neighbor was concerned about the visual impact of the project but findings show that there is virtually no visual change with the project.

E. PA 12-050 AT&T Wireless Use Permit & Design Review 1035 San Pablo Ave.- The applicant is seeking Design Review and Conditional Use Permit approval to allow nine (9) new panel antennas on an existing office building at 1035 San Pablo Ave. The antennas will be housed in new FRP (fiber reinforced plastic) on the roof. The south and west facing enclosure is approximately 35.6 sq. ft. and will house six (6) antennas. The north facing enclosure is 20 sq. ft. and will house three (3) antennas. Both enclosures are proposed to shield the antennas from public view. Related equipment is proposed to be located in a leased office suite in the building. The roof-top penthouse is proposed to be demolished to eliminate roof-top coverage issues.

Recommendation: Approve with project conditions.

Commissioner Arkin recused himself due to the proximity of his residence to the project location.

In the absence of a vice chair, the commissioners appointed Commissioner Eisenmann as the substitute chair for this portion of the meeting.

Ms. Hersch presented the staff report. She added that there has been some additional correspondence with AT&T and distributed these for the commission.

### PUBLIC HEARING OPENED.

Valerie Tallerico, Trillium Consulting/AT&T representative and applicant- thanked Ms. Hersch for her thorough staff report. She described the antennas in greater detail and added the project was designed to meet code requirements. She noted AT&T did look into other alternative sites and concluded that this site was the best fit for their needs. She read off some edits AT&T made to item 9 that stated that AT&T would make any necessary changes to conform to code. She asked that any questions regarding this last statement be directed at AT&T's legal department.

Commissioner Eisenmann- asked why the antennas were so close to the ledge of the building.

**Valerie Tallerico**- explained that the antenna have to be close to the ledge to have the strongest signal. She said that centering the antenna would require the device to be placed 15 ft above the roof to achieve the same strength.

Commissioner Donaldson- asked why the antennas on the East side did not have to be on the ledge, but the ones on the Southside did.

Commissioner Moss- answered that the East facing antennas had other antennas in that direction while the Southside ones did not.

Commissioner Eisenmann- suggested concealing all of the antennas.

Commissioner Pilch- asked if AT&T would drop their lawsuit against the City of Albany if they approved this application.

**Valerie Tallerico**- said that the Commissioners should talk with AT&T's legal department regarding litigation against the City of Albany. She added that AT&T could not modify other companies' antennas.

Ms. Hersch- confirmed that the proposed uses for the penthouse were permitted by code.

**David Warwick, AT&T representative**- clarified that they would be eliminating the penthouse entirely. He said the rear wall would not be changed.

**Heike Abeck, 1037 Kains Ave** - asked why she did not receive a notice about this meeting. She expressed her overall displeasure with the application and urged the Commission to enforce the ordinance. She mentioned that the antenna is being placed in a least preferred area as it is bordering residential space.

Clay Larson, Albany resident- questioned AT&T's claim that the antenna would have to be moved up 15 ft to achieve the same signal strength as it would have on the ledge. He recommended moving the Sprint antennas closer to the center of the roof as they are visually unappealing for neighboring residents.

**David Sanger, 920 Evelyn**- wanted clarifications on the shot-clock procedures. He was concerned that 20-2200 EC3 which states the antenna should be far back from the ledge of the building. He pointed out the 10% rooftop coverage issues brought up in 2008 and said the commission does not need to come out with new reasons to deny approval to this application.

**Caryl O'Keefe, 600 block of Jackson-** concurred with Sanger that the application has been in front of the Commission many times. She mentioned that she was alright with approving the application this evening but would like further discussion from Commission about AT&Ts letter if they had any other thoughts.

Tod Abbot, Albany resident and Vice President of Chamber of Commerce- supported the application and expressed frustration at the process. He mentioned that many customers and people want improved cell service and that those that oppose the application are likely fearful of potential health risks to which he assert there are none.

**Peggy McQuaid**- encouraged the Commission to take action tonight and move forward.

Alan Riffer- agreed that it was time to take action.

Barbara Leslie, AT&T representative- mentioned the tremendous amount of support she has received in regards to the application from Albany residents and her customers.

Ms. Hersch- said that the City did mail a public hearing notice about to 1037 Kains.

Commissioner Moss- said that he supports the application and asked that the wording of AT&T's attorney be incorporated in the motion. He also noted that the previous application was dragged out because the applicant was not ready and could not answer the Commission's questions.

Commissioner Donaldson- said he had no trouble with the use permit but he was uncomfortable with the strange tab structure. He preferred no concealment of the antenna.

Commissioner Pilch- agreed that removing the stealth structure would be favorable. He said he could vote to move the application.

Commissioner Eisenmann- also suggested making the stealth coverings more three dimensional looking to blend in better with the rest of the structure.

Ms. Hersch- asked that a reference to 20.20.100 D4 be included in the motion. This allows for 50 ft setback.

Clay Larson- agreed that the antennas did not need to be moved.

Motion to approve Item 6E with the findings and conditions detailed in the staff report with the following additional modifications:

- Condition 9 more closely reflect the wording of the AT&T attorneys
- Reference to 20.20.100D4 that states the mechanical equipment on the first floor is less than 50 ft from the property line and it is totally enclosed within a building:

F. Green Building Ordinance Update- Review final draft of the Green Building Ordinance changes and forward a recommendation to Albany City Council.

Recommendation: Forward a recommendation to City Council to approve amendments to the Green Building Ordinance.

Commissioner Arkin rejoined the meeting.

Ms. Hersch presented the staff report. She noted that no action had to be taken tonight but this meeting could be to get the new commissioners caught up with the updates.

Mr. Bond noted that the Commission has design review authority to decide if the project has everything done that is maximum points practicable.

Commissioner Moss- noted ANSYS has new green standards for residential requirements.

Commissioner Arkin- explained that the code makes it less inclusive.

Mr. Bond- explained the temperate temperature of Albany makes it hard to achieve tier 2 energy certification. He noted that staff is not recommending that the green building ordinance be amended contrary to information presented in the staff report.

#### PUBLIC HEARING OPENED.

Commissioner Arkin- discussed three big changes- 1) modifications to the green building ordinance by City Council resolution, 2)increase in threshold from 5000 to 10000 sq. ft. for commercial and city sponsored projects and 3) the requirement that residential projects above 1500 sq. ft. for new construction and major remodel require full build it green certification. He noted the option of equivalency has been eliminated for all projects and pointed out an error that renovations above 10000 square feet still had this option. He hoped small projects not subject to design review still fill out a checklist for most points practicable. In regards to certification on projects with design review he suggested a third party certifier. For new construction or renovation of 5 units or more, he proposed these projects also be held to the new build it green certification.

Commissioner Moss- asked if multifamily green checklist 2005 can be struck out and replaced with "latest". The Commission agreed. He suggested that 3 units be considered multifamily as there have been many 3-4 unit projects that should trigger a checklist.

Commissioner Arkin- asked if new multifamily projects of 3 units or more would require a checklist. The commission recommended third party review and verification.

Commissioner Donaldson- requested that staff bring in some copies of the checklists to read through when this item is brought back to the Commission.

Mr. Bond- said that a package would be created for applicants.
