RECENT ACTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL

ALBANY BULB TRANSITION PLAN

The City of Albany received a grant from the State Coastal Conservancy in the amount of \$168,000 to conduct a public planning process that results in preparation of a transition plan for the Albany Neck and Bulb to become part of the larger McLaughlin Eastshore State Park. The City Council authorized a contract agreement with the consulting firm Wallace Roberts & Todd (WRT) to assist with the planning process and development of the transition plan.

ALBANY HOUSING ELEMENT

The Council authorized submittal of the working draft 2015-2023 Albany Housing Element to the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) for Administrative Review. All cities and counties in the Bay Area are required by state law to adopt new Housing Elements by January 31, 2015. The Housing Element presents the City's policies for housing production, conservation, and affordability. A number of public meetings and planning sessions were held to obtain community input regarding the housing element. Additionally, the City sponsored a "Housing Symposium" that included presentations by local affordable housing professionals. The Housing Symposium can be viewed on the City's YouTube page.

NORTH COUNTY WINTER RELIEF - INCLEMENT WEATHER RESPONSE PROGRAM

The Council approved an allocation of \$15,000 from the City of Albany to participate in the North County Winter Relief - Inclement Weather Response Program. The program is a collaboration between the County of Alameda along with the cities of Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville and Oakland to provide warming centers, additional shelter beds, street outreach, vulnerability screening and rapid re-housing funds to persons who are homeless.

The Friends of Albany Parks program was recently created to encourage community members to get involved with the care, maintenance and beautification of their favorite neighborhood parks. This in turn fosters a better sense of community and builds social capital as neighbors meet and work together. As part of the program, the Recreation & Community Services Department has hosted clean-up days at different Albany parks each month. Earlier this month, we teamed up with the local non-profit organization Friends of Five Creeks and headed to Creekside Park. Creekside Park is a rare nature-lover's paradise tucked in the side of Albany Hill. A group of 12 volunteers cleared out blackberry vines and other invasive species. Together we filled an entire dump truck. Several bags of garbage were also hauled away. Afterwards, the team was rewarded with pizza provided by the Albany Community Foundation.

November marks the last clean-up day of the year. Once again, we are teaming up with the Friends of Five Creeks for a fun day on Albany Hill. EDUCATING PRESCHOOLERS

ALBANY POLICE VISIT ALBANY HIGH SCHOOL

Each fall for the past nine years, Albany Police officers visit Albany High School's Identity, Health & Safety classes to talk about interacting with the police. During high school, the likelihood of coming into contact with a police officer increases dramatically: students may start driving, staying out later, expand their social interactions, "live" in a broader geographic region, etc. This October, Chief Mike McQuiston and Sergeant David Belman spent time with Albany's freshman class talking about interacting with the police and describing rights and responsibilities.





GRANT AWARD

The Albany Police Department has been awarded a \$69,685 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety to fund a year-long program aimed at preventing deaths & injuries on our roadways through special enforcement and public awareness efforts. The first of these efforts took place on October 17th with speed enforcement & crash prevention en- forcement and on October 24th with distracted driver en- forcement.

CERT CITYWIDE EXERCISE - THANKS FOR GETTING PREPARED!

Over 350 individuals and 14 blocks came out for Albany's first-ever CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) citywide exercise on October 18th. Participants practiced basic emergency response skills including "drop, cover & hold on" during an earthquake, reviewing use of personal protective equipment such as hard hats and durable shoes, responding to a pre-set meeting location following an emergency, and working collabora- tively to assess local neighborhood damage.




A GREAT GRANT

The City of Albany was awarded a statewide Active Transportation Grant from Caltrans for the design of the Complete Streets features along San Pablo Avenue northern segment (from Washington to the El Cerrito City Limit) and at three locations on Buchanan Street: The Buchanan/Marin merge, Buchanan/Taylor, and gateway improvements at the Buchanan bridge overcrossing. Stay tuned for the design process scheduled to begin in the fall of 2015. The new improvements are intended to enhance pedestrian crossings on some of our busier streets.

ALBANY2035 - GENERAL PLAN UPDATE

The Albany community is invited to join the Planning and Zoning Commission as they work to update the City's General Plan. The General Plan provides a vision for Albany's future, and the policies and actions to guide us to that vision. The Plan is a legal document and includes the City's official policies for how land may be developed and how natural resources may be used. The City has established a website www.albany2035.org to provide information on the project, including draft reports for public comment and announcements of upcoming meetings. As parts of the Plan are completed and background materials are produced, they are posted to the website for review and comment. The next Commission discussion is scheduled for Wednesday, November 12, 2014 at 7:00 pm in the City Council Chambers in City Hall.
