SUBJECT: Policy Options for Residential Energy Conservation Ordinance

Below is a list of policy options to aid discussion about residential energy conservation (RECO) and building energy saving ordinances (BESO).

| Trigger | RECO | BESO |

| Point of Sale | Require Upgrades | Require Audit |
| Date Certain (e.g., within 20 years of ordinance adoption) | Require Upgrades | Require Audit |
| At Renovation | Require Upgrades | Require Audit |

Next Steps:

- Discuss various options and create a pro/con analysis:
 - o Requirements (upgrades, audits)
 - Define requirements (in home audits vs. online tools)
 - o Trigger (Point of sale, date certain, at renovation)
 - o Single Family, Multi-Family and Commercial
 - o Thresholds (size or value)
 - Combinations (require initial assessments and then require improvements for people below a certain threshold score)
 - o Exemptions (high efficiency, low income)
 - o Scholarships
 - o Enforcement
 - o Recognition Programs (award ceremonies, plaques, stickers)
 - o Incentives
 - o Addition requirements (seismic upgrades)
- Engage the community (realtor's association, chamber of commerce, home owners)
- Bring initial proposal to City Council for review and direction
