Initiatives and Accomplishments of 2014

Community Center Foyer Art gallery: We had four successful shows during the year. Tania Salvator's paintings: Postcards From Brazil, Robert Spertus's photography: Beyond My Garden, Herk Schusteff's paintings: The Mystery Vision, and Leah Virsik's prints: Remnants of Paris

Arts and Green Festival: The Arts Committee attended the festival with a booth, promoting the committee.

Albany FilmFest: We had an exciting festival that created a lot of buzz with the new location of the Albany Twin. We had over 700 people attend this year, and we're hoping for even more next year.

Belmont Village: The Arts Committee approved a sculpture by Bruce Beasley that will be featured at the soon to be constructed Belmont Village on Monroe and San Pablo. This piece will be the first thing you see as you cross into Albany from Berkeley on San Pablo.

Dinner with Albany: Members of the Arts Committee judged the creative table decorations at the dinner.

Ohlone Greenway Art Placement: The Arts Committee picked out three areas of the Ohlone Greenway that will be suitable spots for future art. Possibly for the sculpture loan program.
