1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Peterson at 7:31pm.

5. ANNOUNCEMENTS/COMMUNICATIONS

5-1. Upcoming Sustainability Events

Claire Griffing provided an update on upcoming City sustainability events.

5-2. CivicSpark Fellowship

Chelsea Polevy provided an update – her term will end on August 10, and new CivicSpark Fellow Lizzie Carrade will join the City on September 10.

5-3. Climate Mitigation & Adaptation Plan Update

Polevy provided an update – Council approved a contract to work with Cascadia Consulting Group, Rincon Consultants, and BAE Urban Economics for the development of the new Climate Mitigation & Adaptation Plan (CMAP). A project kickoff meeting will be held on August 1.

5-4. Update on Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Polevy provided an update – Five new City-owned electric vehicle (EV) charging stations will be installed in City parking lots this fall. Council passed a resolution to adopt a rate and time limit policy for the City-owned EV charging stations along with an ordinance that allows for enforcement of the policy.

5-5. East Bay Community Energy Update

Griffing provided an update – the program was rolled out to commercial/municipal accounts in June. City staff will receive an update from East Bay Community Energy (EBCE) in the next few weeks.

Committee Member Wei asked about tree removal.

6. DISCUSSIONS AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON MATTERS RELATED TO THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

6-1. Proclamation in Appreciation of Committee Member Ron Golem

The Sustainability Committee signed a resolution for Committee Member Howard expressing their appreciation for his service to the City of Albany. They thanked him for his commitment to making Albany a more environmentally responsible city since his appointment in November 2014.

6-2. Proclamation in Appreciation of CivicSpark Fellow Chelsea Polevy

The Sustainability Committee signed a resolution for Polevy expressing their appreciation for her year of service to the City as a CivicSpark Fellow.

6-3. Energy Efficiency Subcommittee Update

Committee Member Wei gave a presentation on decarbonizing residential water heating. He explained that installing heat pump water heaters can sharply reduce greenhouse gas emissions but faces two large obstacles: higher installation costs and higher operating costs. The Committee discussed rebate programs as a way to encourage adoption.

6-4. Outreach Subcommittee Update

The Subcommittee provided an update – they would like to promote sustainability workshops and sustainable home tours. They discussed the possibility of publishing a "special edition" sustainability e-newsletter. The subcommittee discussed large events like the Arts & Greens Festival and Jeff Bond offered to come to an outreach subcommittee meeting and discuss further.

6-5. Discussion of Subcommittee Structure

The Committee acknowledged that subcommittee structure may change as focus shifts to climate mitigation and adaptation planning. The Committee decided to agendize this discussion at a future meeting.
