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Implementation of "Creek Art" for the Ohlone Greenway

Accompanying diagrams and drawings graphically illustrate the installation typical of one of the three creek art installations along the Greenway and the other two are substantially the same for purposes of installation.


- I. Demarcate the area for installation by cones and other city approved means of defining as well as closing off the site area to public access.
- 2. Construction crew, supervised by artists, to cut out of existing asphalt and remove, a rectangular section approximately 4'x6' in size, material to be disposed of in approved manner and taken to a construction dump site. Please note, we originally thought we would be able to construct the artistic portion of the work off site, thus reducing dramatically the time needed for on site disruption but the costs inherent in transporting and hoisting the finished art work has proved not to be cost effective.
- 3. Exposed area under asphalt to be graded level approximately 4" below grade. Concrete to be poured on location and screed level as a rectangular bed approximately I" below grade and allowed to dry and cure for a period of about a week, or until suitable for succeeding layer of concrete aggregate mix.
- 4. Construction crew and artists will install network of bronze metal waves as approved in original application plus the requisite bronze plaque satisfying criteria listed in instructions acknowledging funding source, date, purpose of art, significance of location and identity of artists. The bronze material of all exposed metal will be environmentally durable for exterior exposure as per instructions of the art call. Anchoring material may be stainless steel and other durable materials and embedded in concrete requiring no maintenance.
- 5. Construction crew under artists' supervision, will pour on site around and under the bronze metal network, a finishing layer of colored concrete aggregate mix with effective long term durability of terrazzo. This surface must be cured and dried over a period of several days and thus will require continued isolation of area to general public to prevent hand prints and the like. This layer will be ground down to a rough texturized surface to provide a no skid texture to both concrete and metal. Detritus from grinding will be environmentally removed and may include sand from sandblasting if necessary. Exposed surface should be maintenance free.
- 6. Surface will be finished and presentable after this sequence of installation processes in each of three locations is completed, ending with finish grinding and/or sand blasting. At completion of work each site will be cleaned and ready for any opening event so scheduled.








- Ic. Protect site while curing and drying with approved barriers and cones.

Debunking Stereotypes Through Muralism Art Project for Albany

Name of the Project: Debunking Stereotypes Through Muralism

Description of the Project: The project Debunking Stereotypes Through Muralism is a public art project that combines art and issues of social justice, promoting diversity and a positive perspective, inclusion and representation of all community members. The project consists in the creation of a public mural that includes in its design, counter narratives developed by open dialogues with community members, regarding negative stereotypes promoted against ethnic, racial, religious or cultural groups. The point of the counter narrative is to show the opposite a stereotype suggests, in other words, the counter narrative proofs a particular stereotype wrong.

The discussion about stereotypes and counter narratives will be developed by opening a dialog with a different actors of Albany's community members. This experience has been carried out, by us, in other communities with great success, the multidisciplinary expertise of our team will ensure a safe space for conversation.

Given the times we live in and previous events that have happened in Albany, we see as artists and community members the great need to use art to promote social values of respect, acceptance and inclusiveness. Also, strong cultural diversity is significant characteristic of Albany.

Visual description of the Project: The mural's design will be created after the conversations are carried with community members, it will also include designs that evoke that evoke music and nature, one, given to the characteristics of the sight and to the characteristics of Albany.

Besides the painting component, we would like to enhance the mural with a few small pieces of fused glass insects and birds. These inclusions would be permanent and totally secured within the mural. The glass pieces would be added with the technique of mosaic. There are not many murals in our area with tridimensional characteristics, this component will make our mural unique.

We are attaching work samples that show previous murals and previous pieces of fused glass.

Proposed Site for the project: The mural will be painted in the wall of the local music venue lvy Room, located at 860 San Pablo Ave, Albany, CA 94706. Contact has been stablished with Mrs Lani Torres, who is thrilled to have the mural be painted by her store. The site goes in concordance with the sites the City of Albany Public Arts Master Plan intents to enhance.

Activities that would be included in this project:

Community debunking stereotypes dialogue sessions. These sessions will be tree and they will
be held at different sites in Albany to ensure a diversity of participation. These sessions include
a small presentation, followed by a dialogue about stereotypes and how we could represent a
counter narrative for them in a mural.

- Gathering and analyzing the information gathered in the sessions to decide on the elements that would be included in the mural.
- Design the mural, the lead artist will create the design of a mural that includes the counter narratives created by the participants
- Prepare the wall. Polish, prime the wall
- Drawing of the mural.
- Community painting days. The project will offer an opportunity for community members to participate painting the background of the mural.
- The artist will create the glass pieces that will be included in the mural.
- Glass pieces will be added to the wall.
- The lead artist will design the principal and secondary figures in the mural, until finished.
- Mural celebration. Community members and participants will be invited to small gathering, where the process and the product will be celebrated.

Maintenance of the mural: The wall will be prepared before painting the mural. Given the expertise of or team, best quality of materials will be used in the mural, which makes the work long lasting. After finishing, 2 layers of anti-grafitty protector will be added to the wall, which makes it easily cleanable in case of the mural being vandalized. Generally, walls that are painted with murals are rarely victims of vandalism. Still, the lead artistscommits to three years of maintenance after the project is finished.

Cristian Muñoz's artistic career started when he was still a teenager. During the years of the dictatorship of Augusto Pinochet in his native country Chile, Cristian supported the student movement and the political struggle of that time as a student and as an artist, working in Ramona Parra's muralist brigade and founding Brigada Renacer. His political murals are now part of several compilations on mural art in Chile and are part of private collections in Milwaukee and Chicago. During his years as an art student in Santiago, he participated in many collective exhibits and the creation of videos and documentaries that participated successfully in several short film festivals. One of his videos is in the collection of The Historical National Museum in Chile.

Since his arrival in the United States in 2007, he has participated in several collective exhibits in Milwaukee, Chicago, Berkeley, Oakland and San Francisco. He was also part of the two artist show Memories of the Forgotten in Milwaukee and Woven in Chicago, which soon will be shown at the Mission Cultural Center for the Latino Arts (May, 2016) in San Francisco. 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
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
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
