Subject: Approval of Construction Contract Change Order #1 for Contract C19-1 –

2018 Pavement Maintenance and ATP Striping & Signage Project

SUMMARY

The issue before the Council is to approve Contract Change Order (CCO) No. 1 to Contract No. C19-1 in the amount of \$115,243.54. On January 22, 2019, Council awarded Contract C19-1 to VSS International (Resolution 2019-01) for street pavement maintenance and ATP striping and signage improvements throughout the City. CCO No. 1 expands the scope of this contract to include the Washington Ave Traffic Calming Project (CIP #24009) and traffic calming measures on Peralta, Francis and Taylor (CIP #25001).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

That the Council adopt Resolution No. 2019-57 authorizing the City Manager to approve Contract Change Order #1 to Contract C19-01 with VSS International to construct the Washington Avenue Traffic Calming Project and traffic calming measures on Peralta, Francis and Taylor in the amount \$115,243.54 from previously appropriated funds for CIP Projects No. 24009 (\$59,743.16) and No. 25001 (\$55,500.38).

BACKGROUND

On January 22, 2019 Council approved a contract award to VSS International (Resolution 19-9) for the 2018 Pavement Maintenance and ATP Striping & Signage Project for \$850,120. This Project is currently underway with an anticipated completion date of June 30, 2019.

The Washington Avenue Traffic Calming Project began in 2014 to evaluate traffic and pedestrian safety issues on Washington Avenue between Pierce Street and Cerrito Street. Kittleson & Associates was contracted to develop a project design. During the design process numerous community meeting were conducted and staff presented several draft concepts to the Traffic and Safety Commission. On February 5, 2018 City Council received a staff presentation on the project and directed staff to proceed with final design including the design and construction of following elements:

1. A raised crosswalk on Washington Avenue at Catherine's Walk;

- 2. Speed humps on Washington Avenue between Pierce Street and Cerrito Street;
- 3. A painted bulb out at the intersection of Washington Avenue and Gateview Avenue;
- 4. Striping, signage, and sidewalk barriers for all modifications.

Kittleson & Associates was contracted to complete the final design including two additional community meetings in Fall 2018. Additional direction to staff included preparation of an ordinance authorizing closure of the northern sidewalk to pedestrians and to allow vehicles to park on the northern sidewalk on Washington Avenue between Pierce Street and Cerrito Street and establishment of a parking enforcement program for vehicle parking on Washington. The design work is complete.

Additionally, the CIP created a Citywide Traffic Calming Project (CIP 25001) to fund traffic calming measures requested by the public and approved by the Traffic and Safety Commission. There is currently a backlog of approved traffic calming measures to be constructed. CCO No. 1 will construct approved measure at three locations: Peralta Avenue, Francis Street and Taylor Street. The scope of the traffic calming measure generally consists of speed humps and striping. The three locations included in this change order have been approved by Traffic and Safety.

DISCUSSION

Since the scope of work included in the change order work is very similar to the work included in Contract No. C19-1, Staff requested a cost estimate to perform this additional work from VSS International. Using the unit pricing established in the original contract, VSS provided an estimate to complete the additional work as summarized below. Staff has reviewed the cost estimate and finds it to be acceptable and appropriate.

Washington Ave Traffic Calming: \$59,743.16
Citywide Traffic Calming: \$55,500.38

• Total \$115,243.54

The contractor is scheduled to complete the original contract work by June 30, 2019. This new work will be completed by September 2019.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE

This project consists of maintenance of existing streets and is determined to be categorically exempt under CEQA.

SUSTAINABILITY

The proposed project supports Council's Strategic Plan in the areas of Transportation Safety and Implementation of the city's active Transportation Plan.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The budgets for the two work items included in the CCO No. 1 are included in CIP No. 24009 – Washington Ave Traffic Calming and CIP No. 25001 – Citywide Traffic Calming, which were appropriated by Council as part of the City's Capital Improvement Program last updated on March 19, 2018 (Resolution 2018-36). The following table details the approved budget and funding sources for these projects:

As of June 7, 2019, the City has either spent or encumbered a total of \$44,570 for the Washington Ave project (CIP #24009). No funds have been spent or encumbered for the Citywide Traffic Calming project (CIP 25001).

The proposed change order totals \$115,243.54, with \$59,743.16 being allocated to the Washington Ave Project (CIP #24009) and \$55,500.38 being allocated to the Citywide Traffic Calming Project (CIP #25001). The amounts allocated to each project are within the approved budgets for the projects, so no budget adjustments are needed.

Crosswalk Change Order Request

Mike:

The price to construct the five (5) speed humps (3 at Peralta / 2 at Washington) and one (1) raised crosswalk at Washington per the attached plans and notes below is \$81,218.

- Inclusions: traffic control for our work, grind & install of asphalt speed humps and raised crosswalk. Also includes pvc pipe at gutter for drainage @ raised crosswalk.
- Exclusions: truncated domes, signage, striping (temp or permanent).
- Notes:
 - Work to be completed by end of September 2019 (sooner if crews become available).
 - Speed humps to match curb heights and transition ramps to be widened proportionally if possible. Heights and layouts to be approved with city prior to construction.
 - Drainage at raised crosswalk includes pvc pipe at gutter (1.5" pvc or larger if clearance allows).





WHEN TRENCHING IN THE SIDEWALK AREAS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL CLOSE THE SIDEWALK BY PLACING BARRICADES AROUND THE TRENCH AREA AND AT LEAST TWO ROWS OF CONSTRUCTION TAPES WRAPPED AROUND THE EXCAVATED AREA, ONE AT THE TOP AND ONE IN THE MIDDLE. A 2X6 BOARD SHALL BE PLACED ON THE SIDEWALK AND BETWEEN THE BARRICADES IN THE DIRECTION OF PATH OF TRAVEL SO THAT IT CAN BE TAPPED BY THE CANE OF A VISUALLY IMPAIRED PERSON.
- 15. CONTRACTOR SHALL EXERCISE DUE CAUTION DURING CONSTRUCTION TO PROTECT ALL EXISTING LANDSCAPING, FENCING, EQUIPMENT, PIPES WHICH ARE TO REMAIN. ANY DAMAGE RESULTING FROM CONTRACTOR OPERATIONS SHALL BE REPAIRED AS DIRECTED BY THE CITY'S REPRESENTATIVE, AT NO ADDITIONAL COST TO THE CITY.

- 18. DUST SHALL BE CONTROLLED AND ADJOINING STREET AND PRIVATE DRIVES SHALL BE KEPT CLEAN OF PROJECT DIRT, MUD, MATERIALS AND DEBRIS, TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE CITY'S REPRESENTATIVE.
- 19. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE HIGH QUALITY DIGITAL PICTURES (5mp MIN) OF THE PROJECT AREAS IN ADVANCE OF ANY CONSTRUCTION WORK. MARK ON A SET OF PLANS THE LOCATION OF AND FRAME NUMBER OF EACH SHOT AND FURNISH COPIES OF ALL TO CITY, ON PHOTO CD'S PRIOR TO ANY CONSTRUCTION.

- 20. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COMPLY WITH ALAMEDA COUNTY CLEANWATER PROGRAM AND CITY OF ALBANY NPDES PERMIT REQUIREMENTS. - 26. HORIZONTAL AND VERTICAL DIMENSIONS PROVIDED ON THE DRAWINGS ARE APPROXIMATE. FIELD MEASUREMENTS MAY VARY FROM THOSE ON THE DRAWINGS. ADJUSTMENTS TO LINE AND GRADE MAY BE MADE BY THE ENGINEER DURING CONSTRUCTION. PAYMENT WILL BE BASED ON QUANTITIES INSTALLED.
- 27. SHOULD IT APPEAR THAT THE WORK TO BE DONE OR ANY MATTER RELATIVE THERETO, IS INSUFFICIENTLY OR INCORRECTLY DETAILED OR EXPLAINED ON THESE PLANS, CONTRACTOR SHALL CONTACT THE CITY'S REPRESENTATIVE FOR SUCH FURTHER EXPLANATIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY.
- 28. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL NOTIFY THE CITY'S REPRESENTATIVE IMMEDIATELY, UPON DISCOVERY OF ANY POTENTIAL FIELD CONFLICTS.
- 29. DIMENSIONS, IF SHOWN, ARE TO THE FACE OF CURB.
- 30. PROPERTY LINES ARE SHOWN FROM RECORD DATA AND DO NOT REPRESENT A FIELD SURVEY.

APPROVAL/COORDINATION NOTES:

- 31. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PREPARE AND DISTRIBUTE FLIERS AND DOOR KNOB HANGARS TO THE RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES AT LEAST ONE (1) WEEK IN ADVANCE OF WORK IN THEIR AREA.
- 32. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR TO OBTAIN ALL PERMITS NECESSARY TO PERFORM THE WORK SHOWN IN THESE PLANS FROM THE APPROPRIATE AGENCIES, PRIOR TO PERFORMING ANY WORK.
