6. GOOD OF THE CITY/PUBLIC COMMENT

Mayor McQuaid opened the Good of the City.

The following persons spoke: Joan Larson, Jim Acock, Susan Schwartz, Assistant City Manager Isabelle Leduc, Neighborhood Services Manager Sid Schoenfeld.

A summary of the comments is as follows: Friends of the Albany Library invites the public to an author presentation on October 10 and requests a collaboration among the City, County of Alameda, Albany Unified School District, and the Albany Library; a suggestion for the City to designate a location where people who live in their cars can park; appreciation for the maintenance fund for Codornices Creek; an update regarding implementation of the rent review program; outreach efforts for the rent review program include community workshops, the City's weekly e-newsletters, responses to individual inquiries, postcards, and a business license insert.

7. COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS ON STATE/REGIONAL LOCAL MEETINGS ATTENDED AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF FUTURE MEETINGS/CITY MANAGER REPORT/COMMENTS

Vice Mayor Nason reported she attended the 2x2x2 meeting with Mayor McQuaid, a meeting of the Friends of Albany Hill regarding monarch butterflies, the Best of Albany awards ceremony, and Dinner with Albany.

Council Member Maass reported he attended the Solano Avenue Complete Streets pop-up event and the community advisory group's meeting. In addition, he attended the Waste Management Authority meeting regarding a change in the Integrated Waste Management Plan, execution of conservation easements, and a grant to study carbon and construction projects; the Alameda County Transportation Commission meeting regarding the high-occupancy-vehicle lanes; and Dinner with Albany.

Council Member Pilch reported he attended Dinner with Albany, the Best of Albany, and Food Truck Friday. He also attended the East Bay Community Energy (EBCE) meeting regarding implementation of the commercial program, greenhouse gas calculations, rate setting, and power charge indifference adjustment (PCIA) rates and the Electric Vehicle (EV) Coordinating Council meeting regarding low-income residents' adoption of plug-in vehicles.

Council Member Barnes reported he attended the final Music in the Park event.

Mayor McQuaid reported she attended Coffee with a Cop, the United Against Hate Week kickoff event, Food Truck Friday, the Solano Avenue Complete Streets pop-up event, the 2x2x2 meeting with Vice Mayor Nason, the Senior Center open house, Best of Albany, and Dinner with Albany. Another Coffee with a Cop is scheduled for Wednesday from 8:00 – 9:00 a.m. at Royal Ground.

City Manager Nicole Almaguer reported the Albany Police Department partnered with the El Cerrito Police Department for Coffee with a Cop on September 18; conducted annual safety presentations at Albany Middle School; and initiated an online LGBTQ training for law enforcement. The sidewalk maintenance program has entered Phase II with improvements scheduled to begin October 15. A tentative schedule of improvements is posted on the City website. The Public Works Department has been working hard to ensure the City avoids unnecessary flooding and encourages residents to take action. The sand bag program is ongoing. Kitchen improvements at the Senior Center are almost complete. The paving project for Evelyn Avenue between Portland and Garfield is substantially complete and utilized SB 1 funding. Installation of water bottle filling stations should begin in mid-October. The City is working with the Alameda County Registrar of Voters to locate a polling site at the Public Works Department. The voter information and sample ballot pamphlet have been mailed. Vote-by-mail ballots may be placed in the blue box at City Hall on or before October 8. The public is encouraged to review the Solano Avenue Complete Streets project website for next steps. Mattresses and used propane canisters may be dropped off at the household hazardous waste event on October 7. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) approved the City's Local Hazard Mitigation Plan, and staff began implementing it in August. Lizzie Carrade is the City's new CivicSpark Climate Fellow. The City is hosting a disaster preparedness class regarding shelter fundamentals on October 20.

At Mayor McQuaid's request, City Manager Almaguer will look into continuing the program to assist senior and disabled residents with filling and loading sand bags.


8. PRESENTATION


