SUMMARY

On August 27, 2020, the City received and opened eleven (11) bids for the Lower Solano Ave Curb Ramp Project, an ADA accessibility project funded by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Staff found the apparent low bid, submitted by Burch Construction, to be non-responsive. In response to this determination, Burch Construction submitted a bid protest. Following the City's Municipal Code, the Public Works Director in consultation with the City Attorney found Burch's bid protest to be baseless. Staff recommends awarding this contract to the lowest responsible bidder submitting a responsive bid, Villalobos & Associates, in the amount of \$401,928.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

That the Council adopt Resolution No. 2020-94 to:

- 1. Reject Burch Construction's bid for the Lower Solano Ave Curb Ramps Project as non-responsive; and
- 2. Ratify the Public Works Director's determination that Burch Construction's bid protest is baseless; and
- 3. Authorize Staff to spend Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding assigned to the project in the amount of \$571,705.50; and
- 4. Authorize the City Manager to award Contract No. C20-65 Lower Solano Ave Curb Ramps Project to Villalobos & Associates in the amount of \$401,928.

BACKGROUND

In December of 2019, the Albany City Council approved a settlement agreement to resolve injunctive relief claims made under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in two pending lawsuits.

The cases against the City (Galpern v. City of Albany and Saraswati v. City of Albany) both requested that the court issue an injunction ordering the City to upgrade its sidewalks, curb ramps and crosswalks to meet current ADA accessibility standards. The case settlement included a commitment to provide accessible curb ramps in the project area within two years of December 2019.

Parallel to the settlement negotiations taking place, the City received an allocation of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds specifically to bring existing curb ramps within the Albany downtown district up to current ADA standards. CDBG is one of the longest-running programs of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), funding activities such as affordable housing, anti-poverty programs, and infrastructure development. CDBG funds were allocated to the City for curb ramp capital improvements in fiscal years 2018/19, 2019/20, and 2020/21, as part of the general entitlement the City receives as a member of the "Alameda County Urban County." Additional funding was allocated in fiscal year 2019/20 from the Urban County's Capital Pool to further fund the construction of this project (Resolution No. 2020-46).

Oberkamper & Associates (Oberkamper) was awarded a contract for curb ramp design in April 2019 and have submitted drawings for bidding purposes. In May 2020, Staff presented the 90% design to the Transportation Commission (previously Traffic and Safety Commission).

City staff has prepared and compiled designs for the curb ramps project into a Bid Package. A Call for Bids was approved by Council on June 15, 2020 (Resolution No. 2020-56), with a Bid Opening date set for August 27, 2020.

DISCUSSION

On August 27, 2020, the City received and opened eleven (11) bids for construction of the Lower Solano Avenue Curb Ramps Project. The engineer's estimate for this work is \$525,574. As seen in the following table, the bids ranged from \$400,310.00 to \$563,323.50. Attachment 2 presents a complete summary of the bid results.

As part of reviewing the bids, Staff requested information about past projects from the apparent low bidder, Burch Construction (Burch). The Bidder's Questionnaire, among other things, requires the contractor to provide information about past projects. In response to this request, Burch provided a list of 17 projects on company letterhead on August 27, 2020.

Staff called six of the 17 references. None of the six were able to identify Burch as either the prime or subcontractor for the respective projects.

Concurrent to this review, Villalobos & Associates requested a copy of Burch's bid. Since the opened bids are public record, staff forwarded a copy of Burch's bid package on August 28, 2020. After reviewing the bid package, Villalobos indicated to staff that someone other than the owner of the company signed Burch's bid.

Staff reviewed the reference and signature issues with the City Attorney and determined that the irregularities in the project references provided in Burch's bid and the failure to appropriately execute the bid and associate bid bond through a representative with authority to do so constitute material errors in the bid requiring the City to reject the bid as non-responsive.

On September 1, 2020, staff sent a letter notifying Burch that the City has determined their bid to be non-responsive based on two factors (Attachment 3). First and as noted above, several of the references submitted as part of the Bidder's Questionnaire did not relate to work performed by Burch Construction. Secondly, "Burch Construction" is a sole proprietorship and serves as a fictitious business name for Elethia Burch. However, the individual signing the various bid forms including the Bid Proposal, Bid Bond and Bidder's Questionnaire is not Ms. Burch and no power of attorney was provided evidencing delegation of the authority for another (i.e., the signatory to the various Bid forms in this case) to sign on behalf of Ms. Burch.

The letter also indicated the City's intention to award the project to Villalobos & Associates, the lowest responsible bidder submitting a responsive bid. The City Manager also authorized extension of the bid protest deadline until 1:00 PM on September 4, 2020., to provide a good faith protest period in the event Burch chose to submit a protest.

In response to the City's letter, Burch submitted a bid protest letter dated September 1, 2020 (Attachment 4) signed by Ms. Burch. The letter provided information on the two issues raised by the City. In summary, the past project references submitted by Burch were in regard to projects constructed by Empire Engineering & Construction, which Ms. Burch represented is an affiliated entity that is a predecessor to Burch. Ms. Burch further noted that that Burch has several different employees who are authorized to sign on behalf of Burch.

Per Section 13-18d of the Albany Municipal Code, the Public Works Director in consultation with the City Attorney reviewed the merits of the protest claim. This review concluded that Burch's protest is baseless. The bid documents require the bidder to list references for the project the bidder performed, not projects performed by a separate and distinct legal entity, which the bidder may or may not have an affiliation with. Also, sole proprietorships can only be bound by the individual who serves as the sole proprietor or someone who has power of

attorney to act on behalf of the sole proprietor. Burch's protest did not address this issue. The finding that the bid protest is baseless is subject to City Council ratification.

Staff's recommendation is to award Contract No. C20-65 to the lowest responsible bidder submitting a responsive bid, Villalobos & Associates, in the amount of \$401,928.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE:

This project consists of the rehabilitation of an existing street asset and is determined to be categorically exempt under CEQA.

SUSTAINABILITY CONSIDERATIONS

This project involves the removal and replacement of existing asphalt concrete pavement, curbs, gutters, installation of accessibility curb ramps and installation of a bioretention basin. Accessibility ramps provide greater mobility by disabled persons, strollers, and able-bodied persons in general. This promotes non-motorized travel, thereby reducing air emissions. The installation of a bioretention basin helps percolate and naturally treat stormwater runoff, aiding in the City's development of green infrastructure.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

As noted previously, federal funds have been allocated to the City via annual Community Development Block Grant assignments. In fiscal years 2018/19, 2019/20, and 2020/21, part of the City's allocation as part of the "Alameda County Urban County" was assigned to the Lower Solano Curb Ramps Project (CIP No. 25011), as per the Council action listed below. In FY2019/20, the City also applied for and received additional funding from the program's Capital Pool for the project, hence the larger allocation in that year.

As of September 1, 2020, the City has spent \$50,805 on Professional Services (Design).

WHEREAS, the Project consists of a complete re-design and rebuild of ten (10) curb ramps and corrective repairs on thirty-four (34) existing curb ramps, bringing all curb ramps in the Project area to current ADA accessibility standards; and

Mr. Burch:

The City has completed review of Burch Construction Company's ("Burch Construction") bid for the Solano ADA Curb Ramps Project (Contract #C20-65) and has determined the bid to be non-responsive. This determination was based on the following two factors.

First, several of the references submitted as part of the Bidder's Questionnaire did not relate to work performed by Burch Construction. City staff contacted references for six of the 17 project references provided by Burch Construction in its bid. These references were unable to identify Burch Construction as the prime contractor or a subcontractor for any of their respective projects.

Secondly, Burch Construction is a sole proprietorship and serves as a fictitious business name for Elethia Burch. It is our understanding Burch Construction's contractor license is also held under Elethia Burch's name. However, the individual signing the various bid forms, including the Bid Proposal, Bid Bond and Bidder's Questionnaire, is not the not the sole proprietor/owner of the company as indicated on the Bidder's Questionnaire.

Based on the foregoing, City staff intends to recommend the City Council reject the bid submitted by Burch Construction as non-responsive and award to the lowest responsible bidder submitting a responsive bid, Villalobos & Associates. The City Council will meet to consider award of the contract on September 21, 2020 at 7:30 PM.

Please also be advised the City Manager has authorized extending the bid protest deadline to 1:00 PM on September 4, 2020.

In response to your correspondence dated September 01, 2020 with regards Burch Construction Company listed as disqualified bidder:

Burch Construction Company (BCC), would like to address all of "The City of Albany's" alleged errors in our bid proposal that would deem it as non-responsive.

Item (1): BCC did not list references submitted as part of the bidder's questionnaire and also did not relate to work performed by Burch Construction as frivolous. This is in fact incorrect, though the work wasn't performed by the BCC it was in fact performed by Empire Engineering & Construction, Inc." in which I am the sole owner and all employees & staff that performed the task of the referenced project listed, includes me as the owner which is now operating as BCC. We understand though it wasn't clear as to which company performed the work, the company as BCC actually performed the work and therefore has the experience to perform the work that is in question, at a much lower scale. In fact, BCC is currently performing work in South San Francisco under the same conditions and has been awarded.

We believe, on the above issues noted that the listed project submitted, BCC has in good faith achieved the required goals based on the assumption that this contract is predicated on.

Item (2): Based on the bid documents and the required listing of all of all signatures, BCC is not required to have the owner of the firm to sign-off on all documents. We have several different employees who are authorized signers for the firm. At the time of bond signing that was notarized by the bonding company and/or broker prior to bidder's submission, the signature was deemed legal and approved for submission.

It is our opinion that BCC has met and achieved the minimum requirements and our bid proposal should be deemed as responsive. We believe that the City of Albany would benefit from a competitive bid that is of Lower Competitive Value.

It is our opinion that the City of Albany is entitled to waive any minor irregularities in the bid documents, and hopeful that this would be the situation.

 - **2.11** Notice of Award;

- 3. Contractor's Obligations. Contractor will perform all of the Work required for the Project, as specified in the Contract Documents. Contractor must provide, furnish, and supply all things necessary and incidental for the timely performance and completion of the Work, including all necessary labor, materials, supplies, tools, equipment, transportation, and utilities, unless otherwise specified in the Contract Documents. Contractor must use its best efforts to complete the Work in a professional and expeditious manner and to meet or exceed the performance standards required by the Contract Documents.

- 6. Liquidated Damages. If Contractor fails to complete the Work within the Contract Time, City will assess liquidated damages in the amount of \$500 per day for each day of unexcused delay in completion, and such liquidated damages may be deducted from City's payments due or to become due to Contractor under this Contract.

- 7. Labor Code Compliance.
 - **7.1 General.** This Contract is subject to all applicable requirements of Chapter 1 of Part 7 of Division 2 of the Labor Code, including requirements pertaining to wages, working hours and workers' compensation insurance.
 - 7.2 Prevailing Wages. Contractor and its Subcontractors are not employees of City and are not entitled to participate in any health, retirement, or any other employee benefits from City.
- 11. Notice.
