1 **ORDINANCE NO. 2021-07** 2 AN ORDINANCE OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL TO AUTHORIZE 3 MANAGEMENT OF PCB-CONTAINING MATERIALS AND 4 WASTES DURING BUILDING DEMOLITION 5 6 WHEREAS, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) have been detected in elevated levels in 7 fish and sediment in the San Francisco Bay; and 8 9 WHEREAS, urban runoff through storm drain systems and other discharges is considered 10 a significant pathway for PCBs into the Bay; and 11 12 WHEREAS, PCBs were an ingredient in building materials between 1950 and 1980, and 13 during demolition, these building materials may be released to the environment enter stormwater 14 runoff; and 15 16 WHEREAS, water quality within the San Francisco Bay Region is regulated by the San 17 Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Water Board); and 18 WHEREAS, the Regional Water Board reissued the National Pollutant Discharge 19 Elimination System (NPDES) permit or Municipal Regional Permit (MRP) that regulates 20 discharges of stormwater runoff. The MRP includes provisions to reduce discharges of PCBs in 21 stormwater runoff to the Bay; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Provision C.12.f.(ii) of the NPDES permit authorizes municipalities to 24 develop programs to manage PCBs-containing building materials during demolition so that PCBs 25 do not enter municipal storm drain systems; and 26 27 28

WHEREAS, the NPDES permit requires that demolition permits for buildings that were built or remodeled during the period from January 1, 1950 to December 31, 1980 be screened for the presence of PCBs in priority building materials; and

WHEREAS, remodeling projects, partial demolition, wood framed structures, and single-family residence demolition projects are exempt from screening for the presence of PCBs; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is categorically exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15308 of CEQA Guidelines, which exempts actions taken by regulatory agencies to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: CHAPTER 12-8 OF THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLED "RESERVED" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 12-8 - Management of PCB-Containing Materials and Wastes During Building Demolition

- a. The Community Development Director is authorized to develop and implement regulatory procedures to require the management of materials with PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls) in applicable structures at the time such structures undergo demolition so that PCBs do not enter the storm water system.
- b. Regulatory thresholds including concentration levels and applicable structures shall be based on the requirements of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board San Francisco Bay Region Municipal Regional Stormwater NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Permit as it may be amended from time to time.
- c. Regulatory procedures shall utilize guidance and tools prepared by the Bay Area Storm Water Management Agencies Association entitled "PCBs in Priority Building Materials: Model Screening Assessment Applicant Package" as it may be amended from time to time.

SECTION 2: PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be posted at three public places within the City of Albany and shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date of its posting.
