**A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING  
A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 FUNDED BY  
SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017**

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City will receive an estimated \$363,785 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2021-22 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the fifth year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

1           **WHEREAS**, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into  
2 our community’s transportation priorities/the project list; and

4           **WHEREAS**, the City used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project  
5 list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that  
6 also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

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8           **WHEREAS**, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment  
9 found that the City’s streets and roads are in an “at-risk” condition and this revenue will help  
10 us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets  
11 and roads into a “good” condition; and

13           **WHEREAS**, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads  
14 infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets  
15 infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant  
16 positive co-benefits statewide.

18           **NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND** by  
19 the Albany City Council, as follows:

- 20           1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.  
21           2. The following list of newly proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with  
22 Fiscal Year 2021-22 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

23           **Project Title:** Washington Avenue Pavement Rehabilitation Project, Phase II

24           **Project Description:**       The Phase II Project consists of existing asphalt removal,  
25 6-inch replacement paving, and placement of a 2-inch thick final asphalt surface.  
26 Additional project details include replacing non-compliant curb ramps and associated  
27 sidewalks, repairing damaged sections of curb, gutters and storm drainpipes, and  
28 replacement of concrete valley gutters to manage surface waters at various

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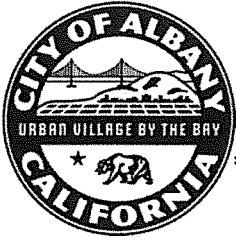
intersections. The project also includes enhancements such as new pavement marking/stripping for pedestrians and bicycles.

**Project Location:** Washington Avenue between Cornell Ave and Masonic Ave

**Estimated Project Schedule:** Start (09/21)– Completion (11/21) based on the component being funded with RMRA funds

**Estimated Project Useful Life:** approximately 10 years.
