

RESOLUTION NO. 2021-97

A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF ALAMEDA COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION 2022 COMPREHENSIVE INVESTMENT PLAN GRANT FUNDING FOR PHASE IV OF THE CODORNICES CREEK RESTORATION PROJECT (CIP NO. 43001)

WHEREAS, the City of Albany has partnered with the City of Berkeley and the University of California since the late 1990s to restore the portion of lower Codornices Creek between San Pablo Avenue and the train tracks as a vital riparian habitat and a resource to the community; and

WHEREAS, the first three phases of the project have been completed successfully; and

WHEREAS, the Albany Active Transportation Plan identifies the Codornices Creek Path as a top tier highest-priority project, and as the path between 10th Street and San Pablo Avenue and the High-Intensity Activated Crosswalk Beacon at San Pablo Avenue have been installed, the 8th Street to 10th Street segment remains as the last path segment to be completed; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2019, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2019-86 accepting final plans for Phase IV of the Codornices Creek project, which includes a bicycle and pedestrian shared-use path from 8th-10th Streets, a crossing at 8th street to link to the Phase III project, and vegetation improvements; and

WHEREAS, on November 2, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-108 authorizing the adoption of the FY2019/20 – 2023/24 Capital Improvement Plan and appropriating \$620,000 in funds toward the Codornices Creek Phase IV project in FY 2021/22, partially funding the project; and

WHEREAS, on December 21, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-123 authorizing staff to submit an application for Phase IV of the Codornices Creek Restoration Project for consideration as part of the Alameda County Transportation Commission 2022 Comprehensive Investment Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Alameda County Transportation Commission has seen fit to award \$826,000 in combined Measure B and TFCA transportation dollars to Albany to support the project, closing the currently projected funding gap as outlined in the current CIP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Albany City Council accepts this grant funding in the amount of \$826,000 programmed by the Alameda County Transportation Commission for the Codornices Creek Phase IV project (CIP No. 43001) through the ACTC 2022 Comprehensive Investment Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Albany City Council authorizes the City Manager to execute the grant agreement with the Alameda County Transportation Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council appropriates and authorizes expenditure of the grant funding in the amount of \$826,000, which will be provided to the City on a reimbursement basis for work performed.
