## A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CALL FOR BIDS FOR THE MASONIC INTERSECTIONS (OHLONE TRAIL SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS) PROJECT (CIP NO. 25007)

**WHEREAS**, the City of Albany adopted Resolution No. 2012-25, adopting the Albany Active Transportation Plan following a two-year community planning process; and

WHEREAS, the 2012 Albany Active Transportation Plan identifies the Ohlone Greenway Crossing Enhancements and the Masonic Avenue Bicycle Route as high priority projects; and

WHEREAS, the Traffic & Safety Commission recommended prioritization of improvements at the intersections of Masonic/Marin Avenues and Masonic/Solano Avenues in the Albany Capital Improvement Plan to address safety issues for bicycles and pedestrians crossing these intersections on the Ohlone Greenway; and

WHEREAS, on November 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-108 authorizing the adoption of the FY2019/20-2023/24 Capital Improvement Plan, including updating the schedule and budget for CIP Project No. 25007 – Masonic Intersections (Ohlone Trail Safety Improvements) Project in order to prioritize safety improvements at the Masonic/Marin Avenue and Masonic/Solano Avenues intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Project consists of safety improvements at two intersections (Masonic/Marin and Masonic/Solano), including restriping lanes on the northbound and southbound approaches on Masonic Avenue, addition of bicycle boxes, traffic signal upgrades, updates to signal phasing, leading pedestrian signal indicators, addition of sharrow lane markings, lengthening left turn pockets, lengthening curb markings, and replacement of stop signs on Ohlone Greenway with "Yield to Pedestrian" signs; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Commission discussed conceptual plan alternatives and provided comments on the 70% and 95% level Signal and Striping Plans, which have been incorporated in the final layout and striping design; and WHEREAS, the Project is determined to be categorically exempt under CEQA (California Environmental Quality Act); and WHEREAS, the project has been awarded a California State Active Transportation Program (ATP) Cycle 4 Grant in the amount of \$410,000 for construction of the project; and WHEREAS, the City has prepared the bid and contract documents necessary to bid the Masonic Intersections (Ohlone Trail Safety Improvements) Project. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Albany City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to approve a Call for Bids for construction of the Masonic Intersections (Ohlone Trail Safety Improvements) Project (CIP No. 25007); and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Albany City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute a grant agreement for the State of California ATP Cycle 4 Grant awarded to the project in the amount of \$410,000; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Albany City Council hereby confirms appropriation of the ATP Cycle 4 grant funding in the amount of \$410,000, which will be provided to the City on a reimbursement basis for expenditures incurred on the project.
