#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2022-54**

### A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 FUNDED BY SB-1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 207

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, as per financial projections received from the State of California, the City will receive an estimated \$410,530 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2022-23 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the sixth year in which the City is receiving SB 1 funding, which will enable the City to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, the City has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities; and

WHEREAS, the City uses a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that many of the City's streets and roads are in an "at-risk" condition, and this revenue will contribute to projects that aim to increase the overall quality of our road system, with the goal of bringing our streets and roads overall into a "good" condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

# NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the Albany City Council, as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- 2. The following list of projects will be funded in-part or solely with Fiscal Year 2022-23 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:
  - a. Project Title: Marin Avenue Pavement Rehabilitation Project
  - b. Project Description: The project consists of rehabilitation of a main arterial street, including three-quarters of a mile of paving, curb ramps, bulbouts, drainage improvements, striping and signage improvements, bikeway improvements, and green infrastructure.

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- c. Project Location: Marin Avenue between Cornell Avenue and Tulare Avenue (City Limits)
- d. Estimated Project Schedule: Phase 1: Start 9/2022 Completion (11/2022); Phase 2: Start 3/2023 Completion (9/2023)
- e. Estimated Project Useful Life: approximately 30 years
- 3. That an appropriation be made of the City's estimated FY22-FY23 RMRA allocation of \$410,530 to the Annual Street Rehabilitation Program (CIP No. 21000).
