A RESOLUTION OF THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING
THE CITY MANAGER TO EXTEND THE CURRENT COLLECTION SERVICES
AGREEMENT FOR AN ADDITIONAL 5 YEARS, AND AUTHORIZING
THE RELEASE OF A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) OR REQUEST
FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ) FOR SB 1383 COMPLIANCE SERVICES

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2011, Council approved the current franchise agreements between the City and Waste Management of Alameda County (WMAC) for collection and disposal of solid waste, recycling services, and green waste collection; and

WHEREAS, the Collection Service Agreement, which includes collection rates, containers, trucks, and special collection programs, is effective until October 31, 2021; and

**WHEREAS,** staff requested an extension of the current Collection Service Agreement with WMAC until March 31, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, The Disposal Agreement, which specifies where collected solid waste, recycling, and organics are transferred, processed, and/or disposed of, is effective until October 31, 2031; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 19, 2021, City Council passed Resolution No. 2021-83, authorizing the release of a request for proposals (RFP) seeking organics, recycling, and solid waste collection services; and

WHEREAS, WMAC was the sole entity to submit a proposal, and staff and HF&H consultants have been negotiating a Collection Services Agreement since August 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City and WMAC have been unable to agree to terms and associated costs in a Collection Services Agreement, including those pertaining to SB (Senate Bill) 1383; and

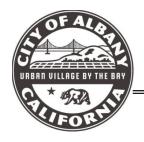
**WHEREAS**, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Act of 2016 (Senate Bill 1383) is a state mandate requiring diversion of 75% of organic waste from landfills and recovery of 20% of edible food statewide by 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, local jurisdictions are the primary entities responsible for implementation and enforcement of SB 1383 requirements; and

WHEREAS, the City requires additional support, if not from a hauler then from a third-party contractor, for SB 1383 services including contamination monitoring and associated technical assistance and outreach.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Albany City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to extend the current Collection Services Agreement for an additional 5 years, until March 31, 2028, and authorizes the release of a Request for Proposals (RFP) or a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) seeking SB 1383 compliance services.
