



**VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN FINANCE LIMIT STATEMENT**

*\*Please see AB571 for additional CA State Contribution Limit\**

In accordance with City Council Resolution No. 2018-48, the City Council has established a voluntary campaign finance limit. The intent of the voluntary campaign finance limit is to discourage excessive campaign contributions and expenditures. By filing this statement, a candidate for the City elective office of the City Council or City Treasurer shall accept or reject the applicable voluntary limit as follows:

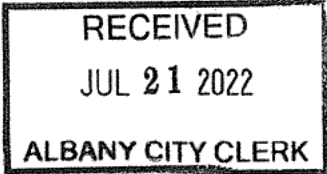

Candidates must file this form no later than the deadline for filing nomination papers.

Candidates who accept the voluntary campaign finance limit are encouraged to include a statement that they have agreed to the voluntary spending limits in campaign materials.

**I understand that once filed, this statement cannot be withdrawn. I further understand that the agreement to accept the voluntary campaign finance limit shall pertain to all expenditures and contributions incurred by me/my committee in support of my candidacy and shall include such expenditures and contributions which I/my committee is required to report pursuant to the California Political Reform Act, whether those expenditures are made before or after the election. I further understand that if I accept the voluntary campaign expenditure limit, I must notify the City Clerk immediately upon discovering any failure to abide by this agreement.**
