# How to watch or listen to the meeting:

## **How to submit Public Comment:**

- 1. Members of the public may attend City Council meetings in-person at City Hall Council Chambers and request to speak during public comment period.
- 2. Members of the public may submit comments in writing by emailing the City Council citycouncil@albanyca.org with the Agenda item number clearly identified in the subject line of the email. Comments may also be submitted by mail to City of Albany Meeting Comments, 1000 San Pablo Avenue, Albany, CA 94706. All written comments received by 5 PM on the day of the meeting will be provided to the City Council before the meeting and posted on the website. Other written comments received after 5 PM will still be provided to the City Council and be included as part of the meeting record.
- 3. To comment by video conference, click the "Raise Your Hand" button to request to speak during public comment period. You will be asked to unmute yourself when it is your turn to make your comment. After the allotted time, you will then be re-muted.
- 4. To comment by phone, you will "Raise Your Hand" by pressing \*9 to request to speak during public comment period. When it is your turn to make your comment, you will be asked to unmute yourself by pressing \*6. You will be re-muted after the allotted time.
