2 3	AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY, CALIFORNIA, ADDING A NEW SECTION 2-1.3 TO THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE
4	ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR FILLING A VACANT SEAT ON THE CITY COUNCIL BY APPOINTMENT AND AMENDING CHAPTER 7-3 OF THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO VOTE COUNTING

8	WHEREAS, Section 5.02 of the City Charter specifies that all City elected office vacancies "shall be filled by the Council; such appointee to hold office until the next feasible general municipal election, when a successor shall be chosen by the electors for the unexpired
9	term"; and
10 11	WHEREAS , Section 5.02 of the City Charter further specifies that "The Council shall by ordinance establish procedures for filling a vacancy by appointment"; and
12	WHEREAS, Section 5.02 of the City Charter additionally states that if the Counci
13 14	fails to agree or for any other reason does not fill such vacancy within sixty (60) days after the same occurs, then such vacancy shall be filled by the Mayor; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, at its meeting on September 18, 2023, the City Council discussed and confirmed the framework for procedures to fill a vacant seat on the City Council by appointment and directed staff to prepare an ordinance for the appointment procedures and amend Albany Municipal Code Section 7-3.6 referenced in the said procedures; and
18 19	WHEREAS, Chapter 7 of the Albany Municipal Code or Ordinance No. 2020-07 took effect by the votes of the people per the results of the November 3, 2020 General Municipal Election; and
20	WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2020-07 states that the Ordinance may be amended or
21	repealed with the affirmative vote of at least four (4) members of the five-member City Council, irrespective of any absences, recusals, or vacancies at the time of such vote.

24	NOW THEREFORE, THE ALBANY CITY COUNCIL DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
2526	SECTION 1: CHAPTER II SECTION 2-1.3 OF THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE TITLED "PROCEDURES FOR FILLING A VACANT SEAT ON THE CITY
27	COUNCIL BY APPOINTMENT" IS HEREBY ADDED AS FOLLOWS:

§ 2-1.3 Procedure for Filling a Vacant Seat on the City Council by Appointment

In accordance with the Albany City Charter Section 5.02, the following outlines the procedures for filling vacant seats on the City Council by appointment. Upon notification that a member of the Albany City Council has vacated office, the following procedures shall be followed:

- 1) If a vacancy on the City Council occurs within 45 days before the certification of the election to 182 days after certification of an election, it shall be filled by the City Council by appointment of the candidate not elected for a contested City Council seat who received the highest number of votes, provided said candidate received at least three-fourths (3/4) of the election threshold as defined in Municipal Code Section 7-1.4.
 - a. If no candidate received three-fourths of the election threshold or a second vacancy occurs within the time period, the Council shall follow the procedures specified in Paragraph (3) below.
- 2) If there are two vacancies simultaneously within 45 days before the certification of the election to 182 days after certification of an election, if one seat has a longer period to the end of its regular term, it shall be filled using the procedure specified in Paragraph (1) above, while the other will be filled using the procedure specified in Paragraph (3) below. If there is no difference in the time to the end of the regular term of each seat otherwise, one shall be filled using the procedure specified in Paragraph 1 above, while the other will be filled using the procedure specified in Paragraph 3 below.
- 3) If a vacancy occurs outside the time period specified in Paragraph (1), no runner up in that period receives the threshold of voter support required for appointment in that period, a candidate who is eligible declines to accept the appointment, or a second

vacancy occurs in that period, the Council shall follow the procedure specified in this paragraph.

- a. Pre-Application: Within two weeks of the vacancy of a City Council seat, the City Council shall have a meeting to discuss and develop an application.
- b. Application: an application will be distributed that shall generally request information from the candidate regarding qualifications for and interest in serving on the City Council.
- c. Application Period: the application period shall be for a duration of two weeks.
- d. Application Publishing: upon receipt of completed applications, the City Clerk shall post the name of applicant on the City's website, with the option to also include the candidate's email if authorized by the candidate. After the close of the application period, all applications received shall be posted to the same webpage.
- e. Applicant ability to withdraw: applicants shall have the ability to withdraw themselves for consideration of appointment to the vacant seat on the City Council. This withdrawal must be submitted in writing to the City Clerk.
- f. Selection process: the City Council shall hold a public meeting to review all applications received and conduct the following steps towards selection of an appointee:
 - i. All applicants shall address the City Council with an opening statement that indicates their interest in serving as a Member of the City Council;

- ii. The City Council will conduct a question-and-answer period with the applicants, which is to be moderated by the Mayor, or the Vice Mayor in the case of a vacancy in the position of Mayor.
- g. Balloting: in the meeting after the question-and-answer period, the City Council shall conduct a repeated open balloting process to appoint an applicant to the vacant seat of the City Council. The repeated balloting process shall include up to 10 rounds of balloting. If a tie exists after 10 rounds of balloting, then the Mayor, or the Vice Mayor in the case of a vacancy in the position of Mayor, shall select the applicant that the City Council shall appoint.

SECTION 2: CHAPTER VII OF THE ALBANY MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 7-3.5 TITLED "SINGLE-SEAT ELECTION TABULATION" AND SECTION 7-3.6 TITLED "MULTI-SEAT ELECTION TABULATION" IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

§7-3.5 Single-Seat Election Tabulation.

- a. Vote tabulation proceeds in rounds as follows:
 - 1. Each ballot is counted for the highest-ranked continuing candidate on that ballot. If there are only two continuing candidates, the candidate with more votes is designated elected, the other candidate is designated defeated, and tabulation is complete. If there is only one continuing candidate, they are designated elected, and tabulation is complete.

 Otherwise, tabulation proceeds pursuant to Subparagraph (2) immediately below.
 - 2. The candidate with the fewest votes is designated defeated. If two or more candidates are tied with the fewest number of votes, the

candidate to be defeated shall be determined by lot. A new round of tabulation starts again pursuant to Subparagraph (1) immediately above.

§7-3.6 Multi-Seat Election Tabulation

- a. Vote tabulation proceeds in rounds as follows:
 - 1. Each ballot is counted, at its current transfer value, for the highest ranked continuing candidate on that ballot. If there is at least one candidate with more votes than the election threshold, each candidate with more votes than the election threshold is designated as elected. If a candidate who has been designated as elected has surplus fraction greater than zero, the tabulation proceeds pursuant to Subparagraph (2) immediately below. Otherwise, the tabulation proceeds pursuant to Subparagraph (3) below.
 - 2. Of the candidate or candidates who have been designated as elected, the candidate with the greatest number of votes (with any tie decided by lot) is deemed to have a number of votes equal to the election threshold. Each ballot counted for that candidate is assigned a new transfer value, by multiplying the ballot's current transfer value by the surplus fraction for the elected candidate, rounded down to four decimal places. Tabulation continues pursuant to Subparagraph (1) above.
 - 3. If the total number of elected and continuing candidates is equal to the number of seats to be filled plus one, the continuing candidate with the

fewest votes is designated defeated, any remaining continuing candidates are designated as elected, and the tabulation is complete. If the total number of elected and continuing candidates is equal to or less than the number of seats to be filled, the continuing candidate(s) are declared elected, and tabulation is complete. Otherwise, the continuing candidate with the fewest votes is designated defeated, and a new round of tabulation begins pursuant to Subparagraph (1) above.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY:

If any provision of this Ordinance or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity has no effect on the other provisions or applications of the Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this extent, the provisions of this Ordinance are severable. The City Council declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance irrespective of the invalidity of any portion thereof.

SECTION 4: PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE:

The summary of Ordinance shall be posted at three public places within the City of Albany and shall become effective 30 days after the date of its posting.
