#### **RESOLUTION OF THE City of Albany**

## AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY FOR LOCAL GRANT FUNDS FROM THE EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT UNDER MEAUSURE WW PARK BOND EXTENSION

WHEREAS, the people of the East Bay Regional Park District have enacted the Measure WW Park Bond Extension which provides funds for the acquisition and development of neighborhood, community, regional parks and recreation lands and facilities; and

WHEREAS, the East Bay Regional Park District Board of Directors has the responsibility for the administration of the grant program, setting up necessary procedures; and

WHEREAS, said procedures require the Applicant's Governing Body to certify by resolution the approval of the Applicant to apply for the Local Grant allocation of funds, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant will enter into a Contract with the East Bay Regional Park District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Albany City Council hereby:

- 1. Approves the execution of a grant contract in the amount of \$771,363 from the Local Grant Program under the East Bay Regional Park District Measure WW Park Bond Extension; and
- 2. Certifies that the Applicant has or will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the Project(s); and
- 3. Certifies that the Applicant has reviewed, understands and agrees to the General Provisions contained in the Contract shown in the Procedural Guide; and
- 4. Appoints the Recreation and Community Services Director as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of Project(s).

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

That Council approve use of Measure R funds of up to \$94,000 for Ocean View Sports Field Improvements

#### **BACKGROUND**

At the December 15, 2008 Council meeting, Council approved design plans and staff's recommendation to go out for bid for the Ocean View Sports Field Improvements project. The improvements are being funded by the 2000 and 2002 RobertiZ'berg (RZB) Grant which is a per capita block grant given by the California State Parks Department. On December 29, 2008 staff was notified that the California State Parks Board voted to freeze the grant funds until further notice. Originally the 2000 RZB grant had a deadline of March 31, 2008. It is unknown at this time if the State will extend that deadline should the funds be released. As of January 26, 2009 we have no further information.

At the January 2009 Parks and Recreation Commission meeting, the Commission voted to recommend to Council that Measure R funds be used in order that at least a portion of the Ocean View Sports Field improvements can be completed. The total project that was approved by Council includes two bullpens, a batting cage, additional fencing behind the backstop, an electronic scoreboard, and a snack shack. The plans for the snack shack are not complete and the original plan was to go out for bid for the snack shack at a later date. The Commission would like to use Measure R funds for the construction of the bullpens, batting cage, and electronic scoreboard.

Since the grant funds were frozen after staff publicly posted the project, several contractors have requested the bid packet. Staff made the decision to postpone the bid opening to February 9, in hopes that there would be more information about the grant funds by that date or other funds for the could be identified.

#### **DISCUSSION**

There were two key factors the Commission considered when making the recommendation to use Measure R funds for the Ocean View Sports Field project. First, should the grant funds be released in the near future, but the deadline for the 2000 RobertiZ'berg grant not be significantly extended, the City would have a completed project to submit for reimbursement. Secondly, over the past year it has become apparent that there is a need to ensure that Albany's sports fields are compatible. By improving Ocean View Sports Field in a manner that it is compatible with the amenities at Memorial Sports Field the City is taking important steps to make the two facilities compatible.

Given that there is not enough information at this time to determine if the City will be reimbursed for the project, it is possible that Measure R funds could be the permanent funding source.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT**

The Ocean View Sports Field improvements do not pose any health risks to the community, but rather offers the community another opportunity to exercise and participate in sports. When not being used for organized practices/games the facility and the new amenities are open to the public.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**

The cost of two bullpens, a batting cage, and an electronic scoreboard including design fees, irrigation retrofitting, mobilization, contingencies, and construction is \$94,000. There is currently approximately \$275,000 in Measure R – Recreational Playfields funds.
