Recommendation to Create a Living Wage Policy in Albany

SOCIAL & ECONOMIC JUSTICE COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

Create a Living Wage Policy in Albany. Commission Chair Margie Marks will present a written document to the City Council that includes recommendations on coverage parameters, wage amounts, and enforcement procedures. The presentation will also include background information and supporting documents.

BACKGROUND

In July 2007, the City Council referred the subject of a living wage to the Social & Economic Justice Commission for its review and recommendations.

The Social & Economic Justice Commission has been discussing and researching this issue over a period of time. The Commission hosted a presentation from Jennifer Linn, with EBASE (East Bay Alliance for a Sustainable Economy), a non-profit that does organizing, advocacy and research on living wage and other work related issues. They define living wage as a wage that allows workers to support themselves without economic hardship. The Commission reviewed other cities' ordinances and discussed and researched this topic in great detail.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The financial impact on the City would depend on whether the affected contractors, lessors, licensees and concessionaires increased their billing costs to cover wage increases. There would be staff time involved in conveying and receiving information to/from the affected contractors, and upon receiving a filed complaint, to/from employees, employers, and the SEJC.
